Letters and proposals

PNew DRAFT is in process regarding the new information learned by FPSO regarding the OSAP application. Historically the application required a foster parent who is themselves seeking OSAP to document their foster parent per diems. Presently the young person whose parent is a foster parent must now include in their parent's income information foster parent per diems. This is a concern as a young person's eligibility for OSAP is connected to parent's income. This is also concerning as in the OSAP document the foster parent per diems are referred to as "foster care payment". Historically it has always been clear that the per diems are for the care of the child or youth in the home; and not income for the foster parents. It has also been a consistent requirement for foster parents to be financially stable prior to being opened as a foster home. As the CAS has not historically supported the view that foster parents are earning an inv=come. Foster parents are volunteers not employees.

Charitable status

- Following the **positive** response from the CRA regarding our charitable status, FPSO this month transacted the process of a membership vote regarding the Letters of Patent.
- The CRA has called to confirm they have received notification of our package arriving at the Service Ontario department of corporation management.
- The Ministry of Government Services has returned out package to us requesting more information to be included; then to have the package mailed tot eh Guardian and trustees office who will then forward it back to the Ministry of Government services, before it will come back to us as all approved.
- At that point we sent it back to the CRA, and they will send us our notification of charitable status reinstatement.
- Following that we will apply for the HST rebate the charitable status entitles us to.

Private membership

- FPSO continues to pursue members in the private sector, this month the work in this area was mainly the mail out to all private operators with all membership and conference information.
- In the last week of July prior to the mail out one of the private operators reached out to FPSO through the website requesting membership information. They received an advance email of the package that was getting ready for the mail out.
